I would also like to thank our exceptional Board of Directors, who continue to meet regularly, monitor our progress, and provide valuable assistance to Camp Maple Leaf. Of particular note this year was the hosting of a new program called Camp FromAway, which was a uniquely designed online camp experience tailored to kids living with Cystic Fibrosis. I am grateful for our partners at uPopolis for helping make this program a success.

I'm proud to say we have great people who help make all this possible. I'm particularly grateful for our host locations in Alberta and New Brunswick for their cooperation and interest in providing Camp Maple Leaf programs across Canada. When we started in 2016 we hoped to serve 250 to 300 campers. Next year we hope to be serving in excess of 1,500. That's certainly something to be thankful for.

CML * JACOB ISLAND ONTARIO

There's nothing better than to welcome a new group of campers with unique life challenges to Camp Maple Leaf and be able to offer them a wonderful camp experience. I am so grateful for the opportunities presented this year that allowed us to do that.

For example, this past summer we hosted our first-ever Gilda's Toronto Family Camp, for children and youth under age 18 who have a family member with a cancer diagnosis or who have lost a family member to cancer. To accommodate the campers who enrolled in this program we had to make some adjustments. We call it "modiflying," – modifying elements of camp on the fly. We incorporated special elements unique to that group's needs, running programs at a slower pace and adding a unique illumination ceremony that featured the release of painted lanterns that floated on the water. And thanks to Chopper and our amazing maintenance team who made special reflection benches and placed them all around the camp so Gilda's participants could find places to rest when walking around. The program was amazing, and everyone went home with new friends and connections. I'm extremely grateful for groups like Gilda's who also serve children with similar unique life challenges and entrust us with their time and their hearts to deliver programs like this.

Another camp initiative we started this year was an online program called Camp FromAway, which was specially designed for youth living with Cystic Fibrosis (CF). Due to the nature of the disease kids with CF are contagious to each other and can't gather for an in-person camp experience. The idea of hosting a CF camp was born in 2020, when Camp Maple Leaf had to turn to online programming during the COVID pandemic. To deliver Camp FromAway we turned to uPopulus, a group of experts in online programming and technology. We feel we ere able to develop a pretty powerful partnership between our CML staff, uPopulus, and the 22 CF kids who got to enjoy camp for the first time.

There were other examples too, including our new Friendship Program and another one called Brave, which empowers kids to have a bigger voice to help defend themselves against bullying. I'm grateful for the flexibility and commitment of our staff and volunteers who, with the support of our donors have helped us introduce these new programs.

I'd also like to give a shout out to everyone who helps refer Camp Maple Leaf to potential new campers, partners, and other organizations. As a result, all of our military sessions are running at close to capacity. I'm also grateful for the children who grow up through our camp family and who have chosen as young adults to spend their summers with us as staff. I'm proud to say our staff and volunteer team is now made up of individuals that cross over every one of our partner groups. Who better than them to have empathy for what kids are going through.

It really does take a village.

CML * GREENHILL LAKE NEW BRUNSWICK

One of the biggest highlights for me this year was making the permanent move to New Brunswick - the location of Camp Maple Leaf - Greenhill Lake. It's so close to Fredericton and to the Gagetown Military Base which makes it easy for military families to get involved with camp.

The camp at Greenhill Lake is in a gorgeous location. The camp site is fabulous and a great place to host our programs including Camp 321, our family camp for children living with Down Syndrome. It was really fun to see how families enjoyed the site and to put the facilities to a new use we hadn't experienced here before. We've hosted the Camp 321 program for several years in Ontario, but this was the first time it was offered in New Brunswick. Seven families participated in our first year of the program and we're hoping to host two more family camps in 2024.

Another pilot program that we hosted at Greenhill Lake this summer was Camp Liberté, a camp for children living with skin conditions. It was the first time the camp had been offered in New Brunswick and we had six campers who came to our second program session. Since we started the Camp Maple Leaf program in New Brunswick it's been primarily attended by children from military families. But Camp Maple Leaf's programs also serve a variety of campers living with unique life challenges, so it's great to see our camper community expanding.

We're in a unique position here at Camp Maple Leaf - Greenhill Lake because we not only share the facilities with Green Hill Lake Camp, but we also share their staff. I'm so grateful for the staff as they were such a pleasure to work with. They were well trained, capable, and really seemed to have fun working with us. Even though they hadn't grown up at Camp Maple Leaf you could see the enjoyment and their passion for the camp.

Next year we're looking forward to hosting three weeks of children's camp at Greenhill Lake as well as our family camp sessions. We're excited about building new relationship and really looking forward to growing our programs next summer.

CML * SYLVAN LAKE ALBERTA

This year marked an incredible milestone in the ongoing evolution of Camp Maple Leaf. After making Camp Maple Leaf history in 2022 with the opening of a second CML program in New Brunswick, our team has done it again. Through the hard work and dedication of everyone involved, we were thrilled to be able to open third location of Camp Maple Leaf, this one at Kuriakos Camp on Sylvan Lake in Alberta.

CML Sylvan Lake was the realization of our goal to have three Camp Maple Leaf programs serving campers across Canada. That has been a driving force of our board and senior staff since we reopened the Jacob Island location. Our primary focus for year one of our Alberta program has been to serve campers from military families, and in that regard, we're delighted with the success we had this year. In total, 62 campers from military families based in BC and Alberta attended the program at Camp Maple Leaf – Sylvan Lake.

Our new Alberta camp location was the missing piece in our expanding Camp Maple Leaf family. The establishment of this new camp program has allowed us to offer a full range of CML activities including rock wall climbing, a fabulous arts and crafts centre, and crystal-clear water for boating and fishing. This third location also allowed us to enjoy a historic opportunity; all three camps hosted the "Red Versus Blue Island Games" on the same day, allowing campers to experience this super-fun Camp Maple Leaf tradition.

With the success of the inaugural program in Alberta, Camp Maple Leaf is now well situated to welcome children of serving military and Veteran's families at three locations across Canada. Having camps in Alberta, Ontario, and New Brunswick makes it much more convenient for campers to make it to camp, and for that we are entirely grateful.
